#### Application Deadlines:

Grant requests may be submitted from January 15 to May 29, 2015. (The 2016 application cycle will be available early in the year.)

#### Areas of Interest:

The purpose of the Gladys Brooks Foundation is to provide for the intellectual, moral, and physical welfare of the people of the United States by establishing and supporting nonprofit libraries, educational institutions, and hospitals and clinics.

Generally the Foundation will only consider grant applications from nonprofit organizations located in the states listed above.

The Foundation will consider major grant applications in the following fields:

#### Libraries

Library grant applications will be considered for resource endowments (print, film, electronic database, speakers/workshops), capital construction, and innovative equipment. Projects fostering broader public access to global information sources utilizing collaborative efforts, pioneering technologies, and equipment are encouraged.

#### **Educational Institutions**

Grant applications from universities, colleges, and secondary schools will be considered for:

- educational endowments to fund scholarships based solely on educational achievements, leadership, and academic ability of the student;
- endowments to support fellowships and teaching chairs for educators who confine their
  activities primarily to classroom instruction in the liberal arts, mathematics, and the sciences
  during the academic year, and,
- erection or endowment of buildings, wings, or additions to buildings for educational purposes.

#### Hospitals and Clinics

Grant applications from hospitals and clinics will be considered where the proposal demonstrates one or more of the following:

- · a new health need:
- an improvement in the quality of healthcare; and,
- reduced health costs with better patient outcomes.

Grant applications will be considered where:

- outside funding (including governmental) is not available;
- the project will be largely funded by the grant unless the grant request covers a discrete component of a larger project; and,
- the funds will be used for capital projects, including equipment or endowments.

#### Application Procedures:

- Review scoping doc / logic model
- Persuasion
- Clarity
- Use their language
- Back up reader(s)

# Step 5. Get real on budget

- Simple Start
- Move up to Complex

# Starting a budget

- Why a spreadsheet?
- Inputs from logic model
- Due diligence
- Match



# Moving to complex

- Overhead
- Benefits
- Include everything
- Another tool: the project budget, then the grant budget



# Step 6. You won! Now what?

- Celebrate!
- Shift into project management mode
- Track commitments and reporting
- Leverage your grants
